The utility room is damp, needed all light bulbs replaced, was full of items slowly being wrecked by rust, was disorganized and a place no one wanted to enter to try find anything.



The area under the front steps was full of items we "might need someday." However the damp environment destroyed what was there. It too was dark and disorganized.







Barb Redig designed a new vent cover (for under the stairs storage). It is located when you enter the church via the basement.

- Check that all light bulbs work, replace as needed
- Wasps get rid of, known nest in exterior light on SW side of elevator Fill hole that birds are getting into the church on the south side of the building
- Wash pew cushion covers
- Check smoke detectors
- Go through cords in balcony get rid of broken or ones we won't use
- Go through technology get rid of old projectors, VHS players
- Remove cardboard stash from garage Go through utility room
 - o Remove unusable items
 - o Make sure all items are stored off the ground
 - O Clean the area
- Repaint front of sanctuary
- Update sign outside
- Add railing to go up front of sanctuary
- Add railing going into office
- Replace railing going up to balcony Spray parking lot to kill weeds
- ons to rust in elevator's mechanical room
- o See if sump-pump is working under elevator
- mounted doorstop attached to doors at top of steps / back of
- o Check windows for signs of water leakage/damage
- Set up dehumidifiers to run for the summer
- Fix or replace mailbox
- Check that garage door opens all the way
- Clear up bulletin boards
- Paint outside door going to stairs leading to library Check fuse for cross lights
- Dehumidifier by water fountain only works when mostly plugged in Investigate water damage stains to office basement ceiling
