

Some of you may have noticed the screen occasionally blanking out for a second or two, or Keith needing to re-set up the words on screen. The men feel they have found the issue and have taken steps to correct it. While simply replacing a part would help, they chose to also rearrange the placement of the things needed to operate the audio and visual equipment. The new arrangement will make it easier for one person to be making changes on the soundboard, while also changing slides or starting/stopping videos.



While the set up looks slightly overwhelming, most of it operates fairly easily. The small box on top operates the volume of the 8 wireless microphones (now easy to reach, instead of trying to access it between the desk and cabinet, while trying not to knock down a computer monitor). While we have access to 27 sliders to control volume outputs, on a typical Sunday we only use 2, pulpit mic and computer input. Below the computer monitors is a tape deck/multiplayer CD player that allows tracks to be queued up, waiting for us to hit play when ready.
